You may use sources like the Westminster Confession and Catechisms and the Belgic Confession, Heidelberg Catechism and the Canons of Dordt. You are to write a brief paragraph on each topic. 2. The cessation of revelation and the finality of the Scriptural canon (the 66 books of the OT and NT).
3. The sufficiency of Scripture.
4. The Trinity.
5. The doctrine of man, the fall and sin.
6. The person and work of Christ.
7. Christ's death and resurrection.
8. Justification.
9. Sanctification.
10. Covenant theology.
11. Dispensationalism.
12. The final state of man.
13. The future, final coming of Christ.
14. The doctrine and nature of the church and its roles in God's plan of redemption.
15. The sacraments.
16. The person and work of the Holy Spirit including the baptism of the Spirit.
17. The gifts of the Spirit including the "charismatic" or extraordinary gifts (tongues, interpretation of tongues, prophecy, healing, miracles, words of knowledge, words of wisdom, etc.).
18. Sexuality, marriage, homosexuality, homosexual marriage and transgenderism.
19. The ordination of women to church offices (teaching elder, ruling elder and deacon).
20. The role and ministry of women in the church.
21. The doctrine of the person and work of Satan.
23. The five solas ("alones") of the Reformation
24. The five doctrines of grace or the five points of Calvinism.
25. The great commission and the responsibility of the church in evangelism and world missions.
26. The responsibility of the church for the application of the gospel to society through the cultural mandate and through deeds of love, mercy and justice.
